- CINAHL **
 - Available on 5 campuses
 - All the same platform
- PsycInfo / PsycArticles – available at 5 campuses **
 - 5 campuses
 - all different platforms
- Elsevier - Science Direct **
 - Very much like Nature
 - Available on 4 campuses
 - UTK/GSM already jointly license
 - UTC, HSM – separate licenses
 - Sole sources
- JSTOR **
 - UTK – has a bigger discount, then the new Tenn-Share offer
- American Chemical Society
 - Web editions / journals and SciFinder Scholar – two separate products
 - Talking about raising UTHSC fee due to miscategorization
 - These are both sole source
- MLA
 - available at 3 main campuses

- UTK recently bid
- 3 campuses
- 3 interfaces

- Westlaw –
 - 3 campuses
 - probably different versions

- JAMA and Archives / New England Journal of Medicine
 - Sandy at GSM is managing these 2 licenses for 4 campus

- McGraw for ebooks?
 - medical interest, some exclusive titles

- OVID
 - Journals

- GeoRef
 - available at 3 campuses, with three different interfaces

Center for Research Libraries –

- Pay an annual membership fee and they do combined purchases for members, who have somewhat esoteric collections – members vote on what to inquire –
- Head of CRL in Knoxville on Monday, Bernie Riley
- Used to purchase more content
- Steve is at this meeting –is gonna ask about what it would cost for all of UT to participate
- Starting to do more preservation and some licensing for members
